EXCITING NEWS!!

Twenty four of our youth will be participating in a mission trip this summer with the organization Catholic Heart WorkCamp. We will be traveling to Bluffton, SC. Bluffton in the years before the Civil War was generally used as a "slave town" for the wealthy home owners of Hilton Head Island. Since this time Hilton Head Island has become a major tourist attraction, but many of the original slave families still dwell, in poverty in and around Bluffton. Our teens will be working on exterior and interior painting, projects that might include building stairs and ramps, drywall and other home improvement type work. They may also work with the Boys and Girls Club as well as the Children's Centers of Bluffton and Hilton Head. These sites are a combination of child care and work projects. In addition to service, our youth will have the experience to come together with hundreds of other Catholic youth from around our nation in a retreat experience. There will be many opportunities to help support our youth in their endeavor. Starting this weekend you will have an opportunity to sponsor a mile for the trip. They will be doing many other types of fundraising as well. Please keep our teens and this project in your prayers and thank you in advance for supporting our teens.

ACS Hunger Banquet 2010

On Monday, March 1, at 6 p.m., ACS 5th grade students will host a Hunger Banquet to raise awareness about global poverty and wealth inequality. All of the proceeds from this year's banquet will go to Haiti through Oxfam to help feed the survivors of the country's recent devastating earthquake. Attendees will be randomly seated in one of three areas representative of high, middle, and low income regions of the world and will eat a corresponding meal. Therefore, most participants (about 60%) will sit on the floor and have only a cup of rice for their supper. Some (about 25%) will be seated in chairs and eat a modest, one-plate meal of rice and beans, while the remaining few attendees (about 15%) will dine lavishly at fancy tables. Guest speaker Jessica Tripp, a member of Central United Methodist Church, will relate her experiences doing mission work in Haiti and other countries for which hunger is an everyday and ongoing problem. The Hunger Banquet is designed to serve as both a fund-raising event for the earthquake victims and an opportunity to think critically about the systems of inequity that permeate our world. Protecting God's Children for Adults Technology Safety Inquiries

Editor's Note: The following information is comprised of the answers to several common questions regarding technology safety.

Question—How does an online predator use a social networking site to locate a vulnerable child?

Answer—As a caring adult, you've probably already encouraged young people *not* to communicate with strangers online. However, young people utilize social networking web sites to write journals and poems that often express strong emotions. Explain to children that these words can be read by anyone with access to the Internet, even if they have been marked private and that predators often search out emotionally vulnerable young people. Once a vulnerable child is located online, predator attempts to become first a friend and then a confidant of the intended victim.
